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FOLDABLE NET BAG 2.0 (NL)



Benodigheden

- 2 bollen **Must-Have**
- Haaknaald 3 mm
- Stompe naald
- Steekmarkeerders
- 1 klein knoopje

Afmeting

30 cm hoog zonder hengsels, 35 breed

Legenda

- v = vaste
hst = half stokje
st = stokje

Bodem

Maak een lossenketting van 30 lossen.

Toer 1: 3 l (= 1^e stokje), 1 st in de 4^e losse vanaf de naald, haak nog 28 st en in de laatste losse haak je 6 st. Haak 28 st terug langs de lossenketting en haak in de laatste losse 5 stokjes. Sluit met een hv in de 3^e losse (69 steken)

Toer 2: 3 l, 29 st, 6x *2 st in ieder st*, 27 st, 6x *2 st in ieder st*. Eindig met een hv in 3^e losse (81 steken)

Toer 3: 3 l, 29 st, 12x *2 st in ieder st*, 27 st, 12x *2 st in ieder st*. Eindig met een hv in de 3^e losse. (105 steken)

Toer 4: 3 l, haak in ieder st. 1 st. Eindig met een hv in de 3^e losse (105 steken)

Toer 5: 3 l, 29 st, 24x *2 st in ieder st* , 27 st, 24x *2 st in ieder stokje*. Eindig met een hv in de 3^e losse (154 steken)



Net

Toer 1: 5 l, sla 3 steken over haak 1 v in de 4^e steek. Haak *5 lossen, sla 3 steken over en haak 1 v in de volgende steek* Herhaal *-* tot je bij je 1^e lus aankomt. Dan haak je 3 losse en 1 st in dezelfde v waar ook de 1^e losse van de eerste lossenrij zit. Markeer deze steek met een steekmarkeerder. Deze schuif je iedere toer mee omhoog. Je hebt 29 lossenbogen gemaakt.

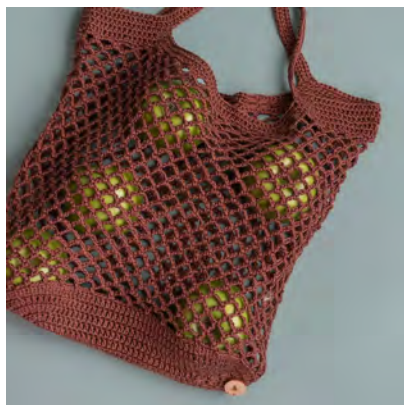
Toer 2: 5 l, 1v om de lossenboog van de vorige toer, *5 lossen, 1v om de lossenboog* , herhaal *-* tot aan het eind van de toer tot aan de steekmarkeerder. Let op! Hier haak je 3 lossen en 1 st in het stokje van de vorige toer. Je hebt 29 lossenbogen gemaakt.

Herhaal toer 2 tot je een hoogte hebt van ongeveer 27 toeren met lossenbogen. Haak aan het eind van je laatste toer 3 lossen en een hv in het stokje van de vorige toer.

Bovenrand

Toer 1: Haak 1 losse en vervolgens in de opening 3v en een v in de vaste van de vorige toer. Sluit de toer af met een hv in de 1^e v (156 steken)

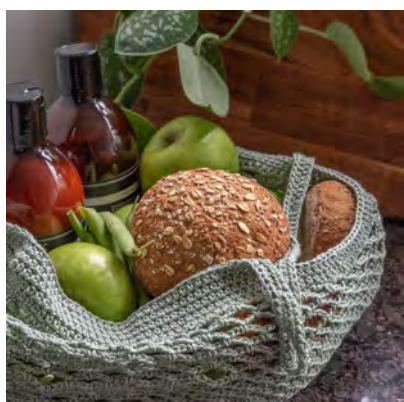
Toer 2: Haak 2 lossen en vervolgens in iedere steek een hst. Eindig met een hv in de 2^e losse. (156 steken)



Hengsels

Maak 1 l en dan 10 hv, 1 hst (bevestig in deze steek een steekmarkeerder), haak nog 35 hst. Haak nu 70 l, sla 42 steken over en bevestig deze lossenketting met een hst (let op dat de lossenketting niet gedraaid zit). Haak weer 35 hst, haak 70 lossen en sla 42 steken over. Haak een hst in het 1^e hst (waarin je eerder de steekmarkeerder deed). De hengsels zijn nu gevormd.

Haak een hst in ieder hst. Herhaal dit twee toeren. Hecht af en werk de draad weg.



Afwerking

Naai het knoopje op het uiteinde van de ovale onderkant aan de buitenzijde.

Bevestig de draad aan de ander zijde van de bodem en haak een ketting van +/- 10 lossen (afhankelijk van de grote van je knoopje) en bevestig de ketting met een vaste aan de bodem in de zelfde steek waarin de lossenketting bent gestart. Leg een klein knoopje in de 2 draadjes en hecht netjes af.

Material

- 2 Knäuel **Must-Have**
- Häkelnadel 3 mm
- Stumpfe Nadel
- Maschenmarkierer
- 1 kleiner Holzknopf

Maße

30 cm hoch ohne Henkel, 35 cm breit

Abkürzungen

- Lfm = Luftmasche
fM = feste Masche
hStb = halbes Stäbchen
Stb = Stäbchen

Der Boden

Häkle eine Kette aus 30 Lfm.

Runde 1: 3 Lfm (= 1. Stb). Häkle ein Stb in die 4. Lfm ab der Nadel, häkle 28 Stb und in die letzte Lfm häkelst du 6 Stb. Häkle 28 Stb zurück entlang der Lfm-Kette und häkle in die letzte Lfm wieder 5 Stb. Schließe mit einer Kettm in die 3. Lfm (69 Maschen)

Runde 2: 3 Lfm (= 1. Stb), 29 Stb, 6x *2 Stb in jedes Stb*, 27 Stb, 6x *2 Stb in jedes Stb*. Schließe mit einer Kettm in die 3. Lfm (81 Maschen)

Runde 3: 3 Lfm, 29 Stb, 12x *2 Stb in jedes Stb*, 27 Stb, 12x *2 Stb in jedes Stb*. Schließe mit einer Kettm in die 3. Lfm (105 Maschen)

Runde 4: 3 Lfm, häkle 1 Stb in jedes Stb. Schließe mit einer Kettm in die 3. Lfm (105 Maschen)

Runde 5: 3 Lfm, 29 Stb, 24x *2 Stb in jedes Stb* , 27 Stb, 24x *2 Stb in jedes Stb*. Häkle in die letzte Masche 1 Stb und schließe mit einer Kettm in die 3. Lfm (154 Maschen)



Das Netz

Runde 1: 5 Lfm, lasse 3 Maschen aus, häkle 1 fM in die 4. Masche. Häkle wieder *5 Lfm, lasse 3 Maschen aus und häkle 1 fM in die nächste Masche* Wiederhole *-* bis du bei der 1. Schlaufe ankommst. Dann häkelst du 3 Lfm und 1 Stb in dieselbe fM in dem auch die 1. Lfm der ersten Lfm-Reihe ist. Markiere diese Masche mit einem Maschenmarkierer. Diesen nimmst du jede Runde mit hoch (29 Lfm-bogen)

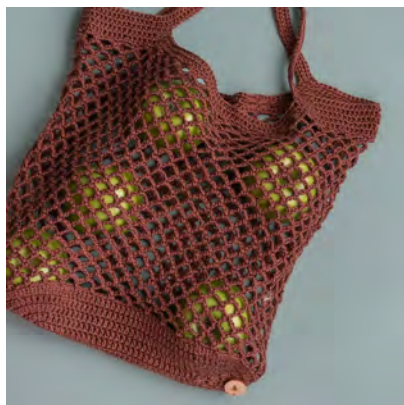
Runde 2: 5 Lfm, 1 fM um den Lfm-Bogen der Vorrunde, *5 Lfm, 1 fM um den Lfm-Bogen* , wiederhole *-* bis zum Ende der Runde bis zum Maschenmarkierer. Dort häkelst du 3 Lfm und 1 Stb in das Stb der Vorrunde (29 Lfm-bogen)

Wiederhole diese Runde bis zu einer Höhe von ungefähr 27 Runden. Häkle ans Ende der Runde 3 Lfm und 1 Kettm in das Stb der Vorrunde.

Den oberen Rand

Runde 1: Häkle 1 Lfm und dann in die Öffnung 3 fM und eine fM in die fM der Vorrunde. Schließe mit einer Kettm in die 1. fM (156 Maschen)

Runde 2: Häkle 2 Lfm und dann in jede fM ein hStb. Ende mit einer Kettm in die 2. Lfm (156 Maschen)



Die Henkel

Häkle 1 Lfm und Kettm, 1 hStb (markiere die letzte Masche mit einem Maschenmarkierer), 35 hStb. Häkle 70 Lfm, lasse 42 Maschen aus und befestige die Lfm-Kette mit einem hStb (Achte darauf, dass die Lfm-Kette nicht verdreht ist). Häkle wieder 35 hStb, häkle 70 Lfm und lasse 42 Maschen aus. Häkle ein hStb in das 1. hStb, das ist die Masche in dem sich der Maschenmarkierer befindet. Die Henkel sind jetzt geformt.

Häkle ein hStb in jedes hStb. Wiederhole das noch zwei Runden. Häkle in die letzte Masche 1 fM und 1 Kettm und kette den Faden ab.



Fertigstellung

Nähe den Knopf an das Ende der ovalen Unterseite an der Außenseite. Befestige den Faden an der anderen Seite des Bodens und häkle eine Kette von +/-10 Lfm (abhängig von der Größe deines Knopfs) und befestige die Kette mit einer fM an den Boden in dieselbe Masche in dem du mit der Kette angefangen hast. Mache einen kleinen Knoten in die beiden Fäden und arbeite diese weg.

FOLDABLE NET BAG 2.0 (UK)



Materials

- 2 balls **Must-Have**
- 3 mm crochet hook
- Darning needle
- Stitch markers
- 1 small button

Measurements

Height: 30 cm without straps.
Width: 35 cm

Stitches and abbreviations

dc	= double crochet
sl st	= slip stitch
htr	= half treble crochet
tr	= treble crochet
ch	= chain
ch sp	= chain space
st	= stitch

Bottom

Ch 30.

Round 1: Ch 3 (= first tr). Work 1 tr in 4th ch from hook, tr 28, work 6 tr in the last ch st. Work your way back to where you started, around the foundation chain, by working 28 tr in the other side of every ch st. Work 5 tr in the last ch st. End your round with a sl st in the third ch st (69 sts)

Round 2: Ch 3 (= first tr), tr 29, 6x *2 tr in every tr*, tr 27, 6x *2 tr in every tr*. End with a sl st in the third ch st (81 sts)

Round 3: Ch 3, tr 29, 12x *2 tr in every tr*, tr 27, 12x *2 tr in every tr*. End with a sl st in the third ch st (105 sts)

Round 4: Ch 3, work 1 tr in every tr. End with a sl st in the third ch st (105 sts)

Round 5: Ch 3, tr 29, 24x *2 tr in every tr*, tr 27, 24x *2 tr in every tr*. Work 1 tr in the last st and end with a sl st in the third ch st (154 sts)

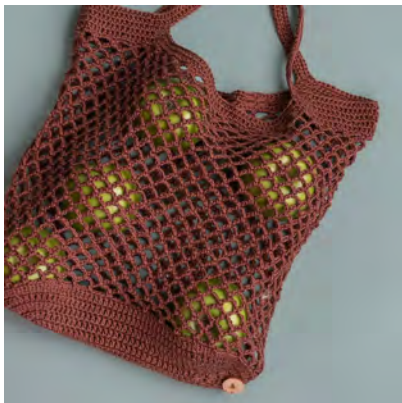


Net

Round 1: Ch 5, skip 3 sts, work 1 dc in the fourth stitch. *Ch 5, skip 3 sts, dc 1 in the next st*. Repeat between * * until you reach the first loop. Here you will work (ch 3, tr 1) in the same dc where the first ch st of the first ch round can be found. Mark this stitch with a stitch marker. You will slip the marker every round, working your way up the bag. You should have a total of 29 chain spaces.

Round 2: Ch 5, dc 1 around last row's ch sp, *ch 5, dc 1 around ch sp*, repeat between * * until the end of the round (until the stitch marker). Here you will work (ch 3, tr 1) in last row's tr st. You should have a total of 29 chain spaces.

Repeat round 2 you've worked approx. 27 rounds with chain spaces. At the end of the last round you will work 3 ch sts and a sl st in last row's tr.



Upper edge

Round 1: Ch 1, and work 3 dc in the gap and 1 dc in last row's dc. End the round with a sl st in the first dc (156 sts)

Round 2: Ch 2, work 1 htr in every dc. End the round with a sl st in the second ch st. (156 sts)

Round 3: Ch 2, work 1 htr in every htr. End the round with a sl st in the second ch st. (156 sts)

Straps

Ch 1, 10 sl sts, htr 1 (mark this stitch with a stitch marker), htr 35, ch 70, skip 42 sts and attach the chain with a htr (make sure the chain is not twisted). Work another 35 htr, ch 70 and skip 42 sts. Work 1 htr in the first htr, this is the stitch that is marked by the stitch marker. You have now made the straps.

Work 1 htr in every htr. Repeat this two more rounds. Cut the yarn and fasten off.



Assembling

Sew the button on the edge of the oval bottom on the outside.

Attach the yarn on the other side of the bottom and work approx. 10 ch sts (depending on the size of your button). Attach the chain with a dc to the bottom of the bag, in the same stitch where you started the chain. Tie a small knot in the two strands and fasten off.



FOLDABLE NET BAG 2.0 (US)



Materials

- 2 balls **Must-Have**
- 3 mm crochet hook
- Darning needle
- Stitch markers
- 1 small button

Measurements

Height: 12 inches without straps.
Width: 14 inches

Stitches and abbreviations

sc	= single crochet
sl st	= slip stitch
hdc	= half double crochet
dc	= double crochet
ch	= chain
ch sp	= chain space
st	= stitch

Bottom

Ch 30.

Round 1: Ch 3 (= first dc). Work 1 dc in 4th ch from hook, dc 28, work 6 dc in the last ch st. Work your way back to where you started, around the foundation chain, by working 28 dc in the other side of every ch st. Work 5 dc in the last ch st. End your round with a sl st in the third ch st. (69 sts)

Round 2: Ch 3 (= first dc), dc 29, 6x *2 dc in every dc*, dc 27, 6x *2 dc in every dc*. End with a sl st in the third ch st. (81 sts)

Round 3: Ch 3, dc 29, 12x *2 dc in every dc*, dc 27, 12x *2 dc in every dc*. End with a sl st in the third ch st. (105 sts)

Round 4: Ch 3, work 1 dc in every dc. End with a sl st in the third ch st. (105 sts)

Round 5: Ch 3, dc 29, 24x *2 dc in every dc*, dc 27, 24x *2 dc in every dc*. Work 1 dc in the last st and end with a sl st in the third ch st (154 sts).



Net

Round 1: Ch 5, skip 3 sts, work 1 sc in the fourth stitch. *Ch 5, skip 3 sts, sc 1 in the next st*. Repeat between * * until you reach the first loop. Here you will work (ch 3, dc 1) in the same sc where the first ch st of the first ch round can be found. Mark this stitch with a stitch marker. You will slip the marker every round, working your way up the bag. You should have a total of 29 chain spaces this round.

Round 2: Ch 5, sc 1 around last row's ch sp, *ch 5, sc 1 around ch sp*, repeat between * * until the end of the round (until the stitch marker). Here you will work (ch 3, dc 1) in last row's dc st. You should have a total of 29 chain spaces this round.

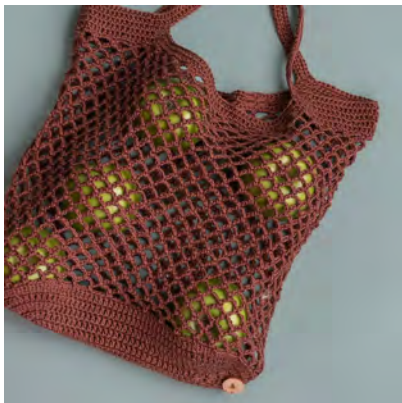
Repeat round 2 until you've worked approx. 27 rounds with chain spaces. At the end of last round you will work 3 ch sts and a sl st in last row's dc.

Upper edge

Round 1: Ch 1, and work 3 sc in the gap and 1 sc in last row's sc. End the round with a sl st in the first sc (156 sts)

Round 2: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in every sc. End the round with a sl st in the second ch st (156 sts)

Round 3: Ch 2, work 1 hdc in every hdc. End the round with a sl st in the second ch st (156 sts)



Straps

Ch 1, 10 sl sts, hdc 1 (mark this stitch with a stitch marker), hdc 35, ch 70, skip 42 sts, and attach the chain with a hdc (make sure the chain is not twisted). Work another 35 hdc, ch 70 and skip 42 sts. Work 1 hdc in the first hdc, this is the stitch that is marked by the stitch marker. You have now made the straps.

Work 1 hdc in every hdc. Repeat this two more rounds. Cut yarn and fasten off.



Assembling

Sew the button on the edge of the oval bottom on the outside. Attach the yarn on the other side of the bottom and work approx. 10 ch sts (depending on the size of your button). Attach the chain with an sc to the bottom of the bag, in the same stitch where you started the chain. Tie a small knot in the two strands and fasten off.
